

Remarks at Helena

770th day

Friday April 14th 1871

This day commence with fresh trades employed in heaving out oil from the after hold sent aboard of the R. M. 786 bbl (mail steamer arrived). Took aboard 15 casks from the R. M. Mid part the same Latter part fine weather employed in trans-shipping oil took aboard 2 cords of wood from R. M. also empty casks and a cask of coal

771th

Sat April 15th

This day commence the same took the last of the oil aboard the R. M. which in all on shore 304 bbl. employed in stowing off the fore hold Mid part the same Latter part employed in stowing off the fore hold

772nd

Sun April 16th

This day commence the same Bk. Sacramento & John P. West arrived on same time off from Bk. Foston Mid part fine weather Latter part the same station watch on Liberty.

773rd

Mon April 17th

This day commence the same Mid part fine weather Latter part moderate breeze employed in stowing off the after hold

774th

Tues April 18th 1871

This day commence the same took 17 casks and loaded them in filled them & loaded them to the ship & hoisted them in Mid part the same Latter part fresh trades. The Water Boat came along side and pumped aboard 180 bbl of water Bk. George & Susan arrived in with 550 bbl oil 30 months out, laying off and on Bk. J. J.

On Board Bk. Globe

775th

Wednes April 19th

This day commence with strong trades employed in painting the ship outside Mid part the same Latter part employed in stowing water took aboard from the Bk. Robert Morrison 29 casks

Broke out sugar
vinegar
& apple
776th

Thursday April 20th

This day commence with light trades accompanied with rain squalls employed in painting the outside of the ship and taring down the life and foot rope (stails) Bk. Sacramento sent 2 letters by her. Mid part the same Latter part light trades employed in stowing off the fore hold with empty casks. Stowed off the main hatch with water

777th

Friday April 21st

This day commenced the same employed in stowing the after hold took the water Boat alongside and pumped aboard 48 bbl of water Mid part the same Latter part fine weather

778th

Sat April 22nd 1871

This day commence with fine weather took aboard 24 bbl of Beef & Pork 150 bbl of Bread 2 Boxes Raisins 3 small chest of Tea 738 lb Sugar 2 Kegs of Butter and a sack of Rice also took from the R. M. Morrison a cask of coal. Stowed the provision in the after hold. Mid part the same Latter part washed off the ship & painted the stem. Laid aboard watch on Liberty.

10th Flour

779th

Sun April 23rd 1871

This day commence with fine weather Mid part the same Latter part the same. John P. West sailed for home (Northwest coast) at 10 o'clock
