

at St. Helena on Board Bk Globe

780th

Mon April 24th 1871

This day commences with fine weather. Starboard watch ashore on Liberty Mid part the same. Latter part fine weather. Starboard watch on Liberty Schooner. Alcyone arrived Capt. Baldwin 30 months out having taken 750 lbs sperm. came up with the jib stay and repaired it.

781th

Tues April 25th

This day commences with moderate weather. Starboard watch ashore Mid part the same. Latter part fresh breeze. Starboard watch ashore.

782nd

Wednesday April 26th

This day commences with fresh breeze. Starboard watch on Liberty Bk Leonidas & Schooner Alcyone sailed at 4:30 o'clock discovered that the ship had dragged her anchor some 100 yds. the Port anchor Mid part the same. Latter part moderate weather. Starboard watch on Liberty.

783rd

Thursday April 27th

This day commences the same employed in repairing the jib stay. Starboard watch on Liberty. Mid part the same. Latter part fresh breeze. Brig Starlight sailed here up the Port anchor.

784th

Friday April 28th

This day commences the same. Mail steamer arrived in. Mid part the same. Latter part moderate weather. Shipped 5 men they came aboard today.

785th

Continued Remark off St. Helena

Sat April 29th 1871

This day commences the same at 3 o'clock took our anchor and proceeded on our course out the Harbor under top sails & courses all hands engaged in stowing the chain & anchor. Mid part standing to the Eastward for the flying jib & Brizzen top-mast stay sail. Latter part fine weather watch employed in lashing the anchors &c.

786th

Sun April 30th

This day commences with light trades blowing by the wind under all sail. Lashed ship at 3 o'clock. Mid part light trades blowing by the wind under all sail. Latter part the same. Land about 40 miles distant.

787th

Mon May 1st

This day commences the same nothing in sight. Mid part the same. Latter part moderate weather. Cooper employed in repairing a cask. Broke out water.

788th

Tues May 2nd

This day commences the same. Land 50 miles distant bearing W by S (true course) all sail out. Mid part light trades. Latter part the same. Land about 40 miles off.

789th

Wednesday May 3rd

This day commences the same. nothing in sight. Land about 30 miles distant. Mid part the same. Latter part steady breeze broke out molasses. Took in the main top gallant sail. Land bearing North - nothing in sight.
