

Remarks on Board Bk Globe

790th

Thursday May 4th/71

This day commenced with a moderate breeze ship on different tack around noon took in the light sails & hauled up the main-sail Mid part the same Latter part fresh trade set the main top gallant sail

791st

Friday May 5th/71

This day commenced the same weather in sight (saw a sunfish) Land about 40 miles distant at sundown took in the main top & sail & hauled up the main-sail Mid part fine weather wore ship at 2 o'clock Latter part the same set the light sails wore a new tie to main top gallant yard ship on different tack (Broke out Mast)

792nd

Sat May 6th

This day commenced the same at sundown shortened sail as usual (Land about 35 miles distant) Mid part the same Latter part light breeze set the main sail Broke out water

793rd

Sun May 7th

This day commenced the same ship on different tack Mid part the same Latter part moderate weather set the light sails saw a sail

794th

Mon May 8th/71

This day commenced the same steering in shore under all sail (ship heading N by E) At sundown took in the light sails Mid part Laying aback Latter part moderate trade running down for the Town under

Off Farnestown May 1871

all sail & 2 merchantmen in sight came in at 8 1/2 o'clock downed the Waite-Boat and went ashore Boat returned at 10 o'clock with cabbage and 91 pumpkins at 12 o'clock took aboard 4 sacks of potatoes

795th

Tuesday May 9th

This day commenced with moderate trade laying off and on at Farnestown at 4 1/2 o'clock Boat returned to the ship with 2 men to join the ship same time Darrell came aboard leaving the Capt to return next Wednesday (here at anchor Bks Nantux Dedmona & President) after taking up the Boat Braced forward on the off shore tack Mid part fine weather Latter part ship on different tack Land about from 5 to 90 miles distant saw 3 whales off Farnestown

796th

Wednesday May 10th

This day commenced with fine weather ship under all sail on different tack Mid part light trade Latter part the same ship heading for Farnestown under all sail at 11 o'clock the Waite-Boat left the ship for the shore

797th

Thursday May 11th/71

This day commenced with wind light & baffling at 2 o'clock Boat returned to the ship with cabbage & 13 bags of potatoes (here at anchor Bk Dracb Capt Braluy 31 on the out with 830 lbs sperm) at 5 1/2 o'clock Boat came aboard with the Capt & Mr Burchill at 6 1/2 o'clock the Capt & Mr Burchill
