837th

July Mon 10th/71

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. at 6 o'clock hooked on to the Whale and cut him in. got underweigh and stood in charge the sunken whale and anchored within a mile of the whale. tried to haul the whale up but was not able. Hands aboard employed in cutting up the flubber &c. left the Waist Boat with the whale for the night spoke the B.H. Moore bound to the landward

838th

July Tues 11th/71

This day commences with a calm at 7 o'clock the Whale come up all 4 Boats hooked on and towed him to the ship got him alongside at 11 1/2 o'clock hooked him to him and cut him in & started the work

839th

July Wednes 12th/71

This day commences with a calm all hands employed in boiling (nothing in sight) broke out a bl of Blom

860th

July Thursday 13th/71

This day commences with a calm at 6 o'clock lowered 3 Boats for a day cruise at 10 o'clock the Landward Boat struck a Cow Whale and turned her up and the Whale immediately sank in 12 fathoms of water. Waist & Bow Boats went aboard got the ship underweigh and stood for the whale at 4 o'clock anchored by the Whale (Broke out Water) have seen 4 Whales this day

861th

July Friday 14th/71

This day commences with a calm ship at anchor by the sunken whale all hands engaged in stowing down oil in the fore hold. Stowed down 26 barrels at 2 o'clock made an attempt to haul the whale up and parted one of the lines therefore gave it up as a bad job and repaired to the ship

862th

July Sat 15th/71

This day commences with a light breeze last night at 1 o'clock the whale came up. Hauled him along side and fluked him. at 6 1/2 o'clock commenced cutting at 8 1/2 o'clock finished cutting and sent 2 Boats a cruising for sundown Boats came aboard having seen 2 whales but was unable to strike them. Started the work at the water at 6 o'clock Landward Boat having the 1st watch in

863th

July Sun 16th/71

This day commences with a fine weather glass night employed in boiling at 7 o'clock lowered 3 Boats on a day cruise at 2 o'clock finished boiling Whale turned up 18 bls at 3 o'clock the Bow Boat struck & stranded at sundown Boats returned to the ship having seen 9 whales this day

864th

July Mon 17th/71

This day commences with a calm accompanied with rain at 6 o'clock got underweigh and stood off shore under all sail at 8 o'clock lowered 3 Boats for
