

Continued Remarks at Annabona

917th This day moderate weather. The watches during the night. Leath' gave fresh beer from the S & W scraped the moss from the bottom of the ship. Traded for about 40 bushels of sweet potatoes.

917th Sept. Friday 8th / 71 This day commence with a fresh breeze from the S & W. Traded for about 30 bushels of potatoes also 15 dozen of Eggs & some Bananas. Meid gave moderate beer. Leath' part the same land employed in Boating Wood took aboard 3 loads.

918th Sept. Sat 9th / 71 This day commence with a moderate breeze from the S & W employed in Boating Wood took aboard 3 loads and stowed it away. Hired the ship in order to paint the bents. An English man of War arrived here today. Meid gave moderate weather. Leath' part the same took aboard a Boat load of wood and about 6 or 7 bushels of potatoes sailed from here today the man of War (Dido by name) stowed the water over anway between decks, started water into the Bull. broke out the sail casks from between decks. The Pilot & Dido are fitting for home.

On Board B^g Globe 1871

919th Sept. Sun 10th / 71 This day commence with a fresh breeze from the S & W employed in trading with the Natives. Sent down the Main sail & ripped it up the trade with the Natives. We have on Board about 100 bushels of Potatoes Meid part the same Leath' part moderate beer. all hands have been on shore today (that chosen to go) crews from the Dido & Pilot have been on shore also.

920th Sept. Mon 11th This day commence with fine weather. Meid part the same Leath' part fresh beer. Ripped 8 casks stowed them to the watering place. filled them and hoisted it along side & hoisted it in. painted the Bunk on the Starboard side. Sent a new fly jib also sent down the old fly top g. sail and sent another second hand one in its place.

921st Sept. Tues 12th This day commence with a light breeze from the Southward shifted the top sails & sent a new main sail. took aboard 20 bushels of potatoes ripped away the old fly jib & part of the old main sail (Dido a letter head of the Dido to go home) Meid part fine weather Leath' part the same stowed away the water between decks also the wood.
