922nd

Sept Wedny 13th

This day commence with a fine breeze from the S & E. Craded away the Hump Back Oar for potatoes & Bananas saw the Draco Boat. Crick and draw from a Hump Back calf. Mid pass calm. Latter part light breeze from the S & W at 8 1/2 o'clock took out anchor made all sail standing to the Westward. the Triton & Draco sailed from here to day for New Bedford and I wish I was going the same route. Drived the anchor & chains ^{spare a little to my brother by the Triton in care of} ^{Wm. E. Smith}

923rd

Sept Thurs 14th

This day commence with a fresh breeze from the S & W at 1 1/2 o'clock latched ship. spiced a shot of line on the Starboard Boat line also one to the Waist Boat & line. Mid part steady breeze from the S & E ship on different tack. Latter part moderate breeze from the S. S. W stirring by the wind under all sail on the Starboard tack. nothing in sight. Lat 2.00 Long 5.14

924th

Sept Friday 15th

This day commence the same watch employed in scraping the gurry from the Grinding Box and cleaning the Machine also cleared up around the by works. Mid part stirring by the wind under all sail on different tack. Latter part fresh breeze from the S & W stirring by the wind on the Starboard tack. watch employed in ^{shoring up} ^{at the} ^{back}

From Annabona Towards St Helena

925th

Sept Sat 16th

This day commence with a moderate breeze from the S & W stirring by the wind under all sail on the Starboard tack. started water into the hull at 2 1/2 o'clock raised a school of Black fish lowered all 4 Boats and obtained a small one hoisted him on on deck & stripped off the blubber latched ship at 4 1/2 o'clock heading W. Mid part ship on different tack stirring by the wind under all sail with a fresh breeze from the S & W. Latter part the same ship on the Port tack by the wind heading W. S. W saw a small Hump Back

Lat 2.30 S & Long 5.15 East

926th

Sept 17th

This day commence with a light breeze from the S & W stirring the same at 5 1/2 o'clock latched ship heading S. E. Mid part heading the same under all sail on the Starboard tack with a light breeze from the S & W. Latter part fresh breeze heading S. S. E under all sail

Lat 2.54

Long 5.38 East

927th

Sept Mon 18th

This day begins the same same purpose. Mid part stirring by the wind under all sail on the Starboard tack heading S. S. E. with a moderate breeze. Latter part fresh breeze from the S. W stirring by the wind on the Starboard tack. boiled out the Blackfish blubber turned up about 25 gallons. Lat 3.16 Long 5.33 East
