

Remarks on Board Bk. Globe

959th

Friday October 20th/71

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the Southward after cutting in the whale braced forward on the Starboard tack set the reef out & set the light sail steering by the wind all hands employed in cutting up junk and minding it. Tacked ship at 3 o'clock nothing in sight. Mid part steering by the wind under all sail except ^{fore} top & sail at 4 o'clock tacked ship heading S.W. by W. Latter part steady breeze from the Southward ship on the Port tack at 5 o'clock started the work boiling on the Head Broke out water. Lat 12.04 Long 3.59

960th

October Sat. 21st/71

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the S. steering by the wind under the same sail nothing in sight. Work employed in boiling at 4 o'clock finished boiling on the head turned up about 12 bls. Mid part boiling. Took in the sheet & mizen top mast stay sail wore ship at 3 o'clock heading S.W. by W on the Port tack Latter part fresh breeze from the S. steering by the wind under whole top sail fore sail jib & spanker nothing in sight at 10 1/2 o'clock finished boiling turned up 34 bls. put on the fat lean. Lat 12.14 South Long 3.39

961st day

October Sun 22nd/71

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind under the same sail. wore ship at 4 o'clock. (lost the hold) crashed off deck. Mid part fresh breeze from the South. Ship on the Starboard tack under whole top sail course jib & spanker Latter part moderate breeze wore ship at 3 1/2 o'clock heading S.W. by W. on the Port tack made all sail nothing in sight took off the foremast & stowed the pole. Lat 12.24 Long 6.01

962nd

October Mon 23rd 1871

This day commences with light breeze ship on the Port tack heading W.S.W. under all sail (saw a Lunnfish) Tack down tacked ship Mid part light breeze from the S.W. Ship on different tack Latter part moderate breeze from the S.W. Ship on the Starboard tack under all sail at 6 o'clock commenced heaving out the after hold in order to stow it. all hands employed in stowing down.

963rd

October Tues 24th/71

This day commences the same at 1 1/2 o'clock finished stowing off the hold lower stowed down 31 bls. Mid part light breeze from the S. Ship on the Port tack heading S.W. under all sail Latter part moderate breeze from the S.W. Ship on the Port tack under all sail nothing in sight
