

Continued Remarks Through the N. East

1135th

April Sat 13th / 72

This day commences with light trades steering N.W. under double reefed topsails & fore-sail employed in leading off the mizzen rigging. gained the Anay Gaff at sundown. Whipped to the wind on the Starboard tack. Meid part the same. Leather part moderate trades accompanied with rain squalls employed in rattring down the fore-rigging on the Port side. Set up the mizzen top mast & rigging. Anay Gaff in sight.

April Sun 14th / 72

This day commences with moderate trades accompanied with rain squalls commenced rattring the main rigging on the Port side at 10 o'clock raised to Spinnaker about 2 miles off the lee bow immediately lowered 3 Boats in pursuit after sundown the Waist Boat struck a small one the Bow Boat striking the same whale 2nd Boat at 1 1/2 o'clock the whale turned up, took him along side and fluked him spoke the Anay Gaff the Capt. came on board. the Anay Gaff also saw a whale to day heading to the N.W. Meid part moderate trades double reefed the top sail & furled the main top & sail rigging with the Anay Gaff. one man taken Dick. Leather part fresh trades commenced cutting at 6 o'clock. at 1 1/2 o'clock had the whale in on deck traced forward on the Starboard tack all hands employed in clearing away the head

April Mon 15th / 72

This day commences with light trades employed in cutting the blubber into horse pieces at 4 o'clock washed off the deck. Anay Gaff and Merchantman in sight at 3 o'clock. wore ship steering by the Anay on the Port tack. at sundown took in the light sail & double reefed Meid part moderate trades ship on the Port tack. Leather part light breeze made all sail. started the works boiling on the head 2 sails in sight

1138th Sat 13.22

April Tues 16th / 72

This day commences with moderate trades steering by the wind under all sail on the Starboard tack. hauled back for a French Brig the said Brig spoke as they was in want of Flour & Bread. the Capt. went aboard and let him have 7 Bags of Bread & 130 lbs of Flour. the Capt. obtained 6 gallons of wine 2 bottles of Brandy 45 lbs of Pork 2 cans of Soup & Bouilli. gained the Anay Gaff (Saw 2 merchantmen) at sundown double reefed & took in the light sail. Meid part fresh breeze at 8 o'clock finished boiling. Cold put on the fat lean turned up 77 bbls. Leather part fresh trades steering by the wind on the Starboard tack. employed in rattring the mizzen rigging & the Port main rigging. Anay Gaff in sight
