^{the} Wednesday 19 strong trades tacked
and retacked same nothing seen
Lat 14 08 Long 37 43 Date 17 44

^{the} Thursday 20 strong trades tacked
and retacked same nothing so ends
Lat 14 16 Long 37 49 Date 17 48

^{the} Friday 21 strong trades tacked
and retacked at 6 AM same
sails and forward and got
at 10 commenced cutting at 3
PM finished cutting so ends
Lat 14 09 Long 37 42 Date 17 52

^{the} Saturday 22 strong trades tacked
and retacked employed foraging
Lat 13 43 Long 37 27 Date 17 56

^{the} Sunday 23 strong trades tacked
and retacked same one sail at
5 PM finished hoisting so ends
Lat 14 04 Long 37 44 Date 18 00

retacked same one sail so ends
Lat 13 58 Long 37 24 Date 18 04

^{the} Tuesday 25 light trades tacked and
retacked employed stowing down
Lat 13 58 Long 37 25 Date 18 08

^{the} Wednesday 26 strong trades tacked
and retacked spoke the schooner
clarry W. Clark capt. Leach
one month out clear so ends
Lat 14 24 Long 37 14 Date 18 12

^{the} Thursday 27 strong trades leading
S.E. at half past two in the
morning the third mate reached
one of the boatstoppers by the
name of Howard and called down
and called me and said there
was a ship right into us &
jump on deck as soon as I could
and hail her the ship but it
was too late to get out of the
way the ship struck us in
the bow carried away the gilt
beams and cathead and tore
the bow up and the she
struck on the Hartland
quarter carried away the star
board boat and broke the mizen
mast in three pieces above
the deck carried away a large
main rail shaves cutting stage
stole one boat overboard
carried away the masts over
