

Remarks On Board Saturday August 2^d 1856

First part of these 24 hours fresh gales from the North with a bad sea on ship lying too under a close reef Main Top Sail and reef Fore Sail to SE of Gaupe Island Middle part strong gales with rain ship heading to WNW under a close reef main Top Sail Latter part the same.

Remarks On Board Sunday August 3^d

First part of these 24 hours fresh gales from NNE with rainy weather at 3 pm wind shifted to SW veered ship to WNW Middle part more moderate at doubled reef Top Sails at 7 pm saw Gaupe Island bearing E by N 20 miles distance at 8 AM heavy gales from North took in sail let ship lay too under a close reef main top sail heading to the West Latter part heavy gales with rain

Remarks On Board Monday August 4th

First part of these 24 hours fresh gales from North with a bad sea on at 1 pm wind hauled to the WSW veered ship to SW at 4 pm saw Gaupe Island bearing N by E 10 miles distance more ship to South Middle part pleasant weather at 4 AM thick and squally at 9 AM saw Gaupe Island bearing SSE 15 miles distance Latter part strong breeze from WSW and squally ship to the East of the Island 3 miles distance spoke ship Catherine of Vera London with two Whales this season

Remarks On Board Tuesday August 5th 1856

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze from SSE with squalls of hail and snow ship to the East of Gaupe Island 2 boats went in towards the land saw a plenty of Right Whales fastened to one hild and took it to the ship at 8 AM Middle part strong breeze and pleasant M. at 4 AM strong breeze and rugged with squalls of hail commenced cutting Latter part strong breeze from WSW and rugged finished cutting the piece fore, and lost the head the Island in sight bearing West 25 miles distance

Remarks On Board Wednesday August 6th

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from WSW and rugged Middle and latter parts the same Gaupe Island in sight to the West 30 miles distance ship under close reef Top Sails and fore sail working up to the Island,

Remarks On Board Thursday August 7th

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from WSW with squally weather Middle part gentle breeze from East steering ship West for Gaupe Island at 4 AM lead boats went in shore saw a plenty of Whales it came on a gale with thick weather boats came on board Latter part strong breeze from SSE with rainy weather ship lying too under a close reef main Top Sail heading to North
