

Remarks On Board Sunday August 31st 1856

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from North and squally Middle part strong gales from S.W. ship lying too at 7 AM more moderate kept ship off East at 9 AM saw Gaupe Island a head 30 miles distance. Latter part gentle breezes from S.W. with clear weather steering ship in towards the Land,

Remarks On Board Monday September 1st

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from N.W. and squally at 4 PM two boats went in shore to stop to whale from shore Middle & Latter parts light airs and variable with fine weather ship to the North of Gaupe Island 10 miles distance

Remarks On Board Thursday September 2nd

First part of these 24 hours light airs and variable with fine weather Middle part same Latter part gentle gales from North with thick and rainy weather Gaupe in sight to West 4 miles distance,

Remarks On Board Wednesday September 3rd

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from West and squally Middle part the same Latter part gentle breezes and squally ship lying off and on at Gaupe Island the boats in shore saw several Whales could not get fast,

Remarks On Board Thursday September 4th 1856

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the North and squally Middle part rainy with gentle gales at 4 PM wind hauled to N.W. Latter part strong breezes and squally ship to N.E. of Gaupe Island 12 miles distance washing ship up to the Island,

Remarks On Board Friday September 5th

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from West and squally Middle & Latter part the same ship lying off and on at Gaupe Island the boats in shore whaling

Remarks On Board Saturday September 6th

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from N.W. and squally Middle part the same Latter part more moderate ship lying off and on at Gaupe Island boats in shore cruising for Whales

Remarks On Board Sunday September 7th

First part of these 24 hours fresh gales from West and squally Middle & Latter parts the same ship to the North of Gaupe Island lying off and on with two boats on shore cruising for Whales
