First part of these 24 hours gentle breeze from North with fine weather Middle part thick and foggy latter part strong breeze saw several Whales to leeward employed in boiling, Lat H^{rs} 48.00 S

Remarks On Board Tuesday March 3^d

First part of these 24 hours light winds and foggy most of the time at 4 P.M. fog lit up saw Whales lured boats and fastened to one whale hild and took it to ship at 6 P.M. Middle part gentle breeze and pleasant at 4 P.M. commenced cutting the whale at 10 finished cutting latter part gentle breeze with pleasant weather employed in boiling several ships in sight

Remarks On Board Wednesday March 4th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breeze and pleasant saw several Whales at 2 P.M. lured boat fastened to one and drew out the whale Middle and latter part light winds with thick weather most of the time employed in boiling

Remarks On Board Thursday March 5th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breeze from North and foggy Middle and latter parts strong breeze from S.W. and ruggd ship under short sail employed in boiling,

Remarks On Board Friday March 6th

First part of these 24 hours gentle gale from S.W. and ruggd Middle and latter parts gentle breeze with thick weather most of the time finished boiling

Remarks On Board Saturday March 7th 1837

First part of these 24 hours gentle breeze from the North with thick weather most of the time Middle part the same at 8 A.M. saw a Dead Whale lured boats and took it to the ship and commenced cutting latter part light winds and close squalls cutting the whale Lat by Account 48.00 S
Long Do 69.40 E

Remarks On Board Sunday March 8th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breeze from North saw several Whales lured boats Waste boat fastened to one hild the whale and took it to the ship at 4 P.M. commenced cutting at 9 P.M. finished cutting Middle part foggy most of the time at 10 P.M. saw Whales lured boats Starboard boat fastened to one hild the whale and took it to ship latter part abey day and hazy employed in boiling

Remarks On Board Monday March 9th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breeze with fine weather at 5 P.M. finished cutting the whale Middle and latter parts strong breeze from N.E. and foggy ship under short sail employed in boiling spoke ship Margaret Scots of New Bedford with 2700 lbs 19 Whales this season wanting one whale to fill Lat by H^{rs} 48.00 S
Long Do 69.40 E

Remarks On Board Tuesday March 10th

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze from N.E. with thick and foggy Middle part rainy latter part light winds from S.W. with fine weather employed in boiling saw the Margaret boat take her last whale and so ends her Voyage
