

Remarks On Board Wednesday March 11th 1857

First part of these 24 hours light breezes from S.W. with fine weather saw several Right Whales leaved boats without success. Middle and latter parts strong breezes from S.W. and regged employed in boiling.

Remarks On Board Thursday March 12th

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from S.W. with thick and foggy weather. Middle and latter strong breezes from S.W. and regged finished boiling employed in storing Oil in main hatch.

Long Dr 68.40 E

Remarks On Board Friday March 13th

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from S.W. and regged. Middle part the same. Latter part thick and foggy weather employed in storing Oil in main hatch.

Remarks On Board Saturday March 14th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breezes from North with thick and foggy weather saw one Whale. Middle part pleasant. Latter part strong breezes with thick and rainy weather. Ship under short sail.

Remarks On Board Sunday March 15th

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from S.W. with thick weather. Middle part clear at 6 AM saw Polar Cap. Variation bearing S 2 ten miles distance. Latter parts strong breezes from West and regged steering Ship to N.E.

Remarks On Board Monday March 16th 1857

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from West and regged. Middle and latter parts the same. Steering Ship. Different courses cruising for Whales.

Remarks On Board Tuesday March 17th

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from West and squally. Middle and latter parts the same. Ship under short sail cruising.

Long Dr 70.00 E

Remarks On Board Wednesday March 18th

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes and regged. Middle and latter parts fresh gales from North with thick and rainy most of the time. Split the fore sail slightly.

Remarks On Board Thursday March 19th

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from S.W. with thick and rainy weather. Middle part the same. Latter part fresh breezes with fog most of the time saw several Right Whales leaved boats without success.

Lat by Obs 48.03 S
Long Obs 69.20 E

Remarks On Board Friday March 20th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breezes from S.W. and foggy with a plenty of Whales at 3 PM fog lifted leaved boat. Starboard boat fastened to one hild and took it to Ship at 6 PM. Middle part foggy at 6 AM commenced cutting at 10 finished. Latter part fresh breezes from North.
