First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from North with rain middle part the same latter part gentle gales from NNE and clear weather steering ship NE by N Lat by Obs 48.00 S

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from NNE and squally middle and latter parts the same steering ship NE by N

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from NNE and squally middle and latter parts gentle gales with a bad sea on steering ship NE under all sail

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from NNE and squally middle and latter parts the same steering ship NE by N under all sail

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from West and cloudy steering ship East at 10 PM shorted sail middle part strong breezes and squally at 7 AM saw St Pauls Island bearing 55° 30 miles distance latter part strong breeze and squally ship lying off and on at St Pauls two boats in shore fishing 30
