First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from N.E. and squally Middle and latter parts the same ship under short sail employed in boiling

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from West and squally Middle and latter parts gentle breezes with pleasant weather ship on different tack finished boiling,

Remarks On Board Sunday September 13th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breezes from West with pleasant weather the three Kings in sight S.E. 40 miles distance Middle and latter parts gentle gales from S.W. and rugged ship under short sail the three Kings in sight to S.E. 30 miles distance

Remarks On Board Monday September 14th

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from West and rugged Middle and latter parts strong breezes with clear weather the three Kings in sight to S.E. 12 miles distance steering ship S.E.

Remarks On Board Tuesday September 15th

First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from N.E. at 2 P.M. the three Kings bearing West 2 miles land boats and went in fishing at 6 P.M. boats came on board ship heading on a wind to S.W. Middle and latter parts strong breezes ship under doubled reef heading on a wind to S.W.

Remarks On Board Wednesday September 16th 1857

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from West and rugged Middle and latter parts gentle breezes from South with fine weather the three Kings in sight to S.W. 40 miles distance

Remarks On Board Thursday September 17th

First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from South with fine weather Middle part the same at 9 A.M. saw a school of sperm whales lured both in chase latter part gentle breeze with fine weather two boats fast to one whale and spouting blood the other boat in chase of the school

Remarks On Board Friday September 18th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breezes from S.E. with fine weather two boats fast, the whale spouting blood at 1 P.M. the other boat fastened to one whale and hauled, at 4 P.M. took one whale along side at 9 P.M. took the other to the ship Middle part gentle breezes from S.E. at 7 A.M. commenced cutting latter part gentle breezes with pleasant weather employed in cutting

Remarks On Board Saturday September 19th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breezes from South and squally employed in cutting at dark finished cutting one whale lost the carcass from along side Middle part squally at 7 A.M. commenced cutting the other whale latter part fine weather finished cutting the whale
