First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from SW and rugged Middle and latter parts light air from West with fine weather Ship on different tacks cruising the three Kings in sight to the East 30 miles Distance

Remarks On Board Wednesday October 28th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breezes from the East with fine weather Middle and latter parts the same Ship on different tacks cruising one ship in sight

Remarks On Board Thursday October 29th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breezes from SSW with fine weather spoke Ship Christopher Mitchell of New Bedford with 100 lb. Whale and 40 of Sperm Middle and latter parts strong breezes with fine weather two ships in sight

Remarks On Board Friday October 30th

First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from East with fine weather Middle and latter parts the same Ship on different tacks cruising two ships in sight,

Remarks On Board Saturday October 31st

First part of these 24 hours light winds from South with fine weather Middle and latter parts calm Ship on different tacks cruising two ships in sight

Remarks On Board Sunday November 1st 1857

First part of these 24 hours light air and calm Middle part the same latter part strong breezes from North with rain Ship on different tacks cruising

Remarks On Board Monday November 2nd

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from North with rain at 4 PM shortened sail Middle part the same latter parts light winds from West with fine weather steering Ship East under all sail in company with Christopher Mitchell of New Bedford,

Remarks On Board Tuesday November 3rd

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from SSW with fine weather at 2 PM saw the three Kings to SSW 45 miles Distance Middle and latter parts light winds from SSW and pleasant steering Ship to Eastward North Cape of New Zealand in sight to SSW 35 miles Distance

Remarks On Board Wednesday November 4th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breezes from West with fine weather steering Ship to East along with the Land at 5 PM two boats went in shore at the North Cape of New Zealand at 7 PM came on board Middle part pleasant steering Ship S by E for Monaghan at 7 PM one boat went in to town latter part strong breezes from SSW and rugged Ship lying off and on,
