First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from SSW and squally ship lying off and on at Munganaie. Middle part the same. At 7 AM boat came on board steered ship off to the SNE. Latter part gentle breeze with fine weather steering ship to the East the Bay of Islands in sight to SE 20 miles distance.

First part of these 24 hours gentle breeze from South with fine weather spoke Barque Winslow of New Bedford 26 months out 400 lbs of Sperm. Middle and latter part strong breeze from West and pleasant steering ship E by N under all sail.

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze from West and pleasant. Middle part the same steering ship East. Latter part strong breeze and squally steering ship SSE under all sail.

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from West and rugged. Middle part light airs and variable. Latter part strong breeze from SSW steering ship SE under all sail.

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze from South. Middle and latter part strong breeze from SSW and rugged steering ship to SSE under all sail spoke ship Christopher Mitchell of New Bedford.

Remarks On Board Monday November 9th

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze from West and rugged. Middle and latter part the same steering ship SSE under all sail.

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from South with pleasant weather. Middle and latter part the same steering ship SNE under all sail.

Remarks On Board Wednesday November 11th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breeze from West. Middle and latter part strong breeze and rugged with thick and hazy weather steering ship SNE under all sail.

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from WSW with thick and hazy weather at 7 AM spoke Barque Dover of New London. Middle part strong breeze and rainy ship lying too under short sail at 7 AM saw a White Whale leaved water without success. Latter part gentle gales with rain ship lying too under short sail.
