

Remarks On Board Wednesday January 13th 1884

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from North and rugged middle and latter parts the same Ship under short sail employed in stowing oil in main hatch Lat Ob 48.10 S
Long Obs 159.30 W

Remarks On Board Thursday January 14th

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from NE and rugged at 6 PM gentle gales shortened sail let ship by to under a close reefed main top sail middle part the same at 6 PM light wind and variable at 9 AM heavy gales from SSW the main top sail split badly in clewing up latter part heavy gales with a bad sea on ship lying too under a main spencer and fore topmast staysail heading to NW, Lat Obs 48.33 S
Long Obs 158.20 W

Remarks On Board Friday January 15th

First part of these 24 hours heavy gales from SW with a bad sea on middle part the same latter part strong gales ship lying too under main spencer and fore topmast staysail, Lat Obs 47.56 S
Long Obs 157.20 W

Remarks On Board Saturday January 16th

First part of these 24 hours strong gales from SW with a bad sea on at 6 PM more moderate with a bad sea on bent a spare main top sail a heavy sea struck the ship abaft the backstays fore chains and took several sheets of copper off in two places also started the sheathing, and stove the lower boat all to pieces middle and latter parts strong breezes and rugged steering ship SW, Lat Obs 47.36 S
Long Obs 156.25 W

Remarks On Board Sunday January 17th 1884

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from SW with rugged weather steering ship east under all sail at 7 AM shortened sail middle part strong breezes with thick rainy weather latter part the same spoke ship Gary Head of New Bedford, shortened sail let ship by too under short sail heading to North Lat 48.00 S
Long 159.15 W

Remarks On Board Monday January 18th

First part of these 24 hours gentle gales from SSW with thick and rainy weather ship under short sail at 7 AM spoke ship Concord of New Bedford with no oil this season middle & latter parts gentle gales with thick and rainy weather ship under short sail Lat 48.10 S
Long 159.00 W

Remarks On Board Tuesday January 19th

First part of these 24 hours fresh gales from SSW with thick foggy and rainy weather middle part the same latter part strong gales from SW with clear weather ship lying too under a close reefed main top sail heading to North, Lat Obs 47.44 S
Long Obs 158.40 W

Remarks On Board Wednesday January 20th

First part of these 24 hours fresh gales from SW middle and latter parts the same ship lying too under a close reefed main top sail heading to NW, Lat 47.40 S
Long 158.00 W
