Monday May 10th
 Begins with
 fair weather but saw
 no whales. Last part of the day
 saw the land bearing to the
 north & east saw both
 Mount St Elias & Mount Fairweather

Tuesday May 11th
 Begins with
 fresh breeze from
 N.W. last part of the
 day saw several whales
 as well as ships at night
 saw the land bearing N.E.
 thick hazy weather so ends

Wednesday May 12th
 At daylight
 made sail and steered
 S.E. strong winds from S.W.
 and lowering weather
 Last part of the day saw
 right whales lowered
 the boats and captured
 one and took to the ship
 Lat 58: 41
 Long 139: 07

Thursday May 13th
 This day Begins with
 fine weather all hands
 employed cutting the whale
 Last part finished cutting
 and commenced boiling
 fine weather saw the land
 to the north so ends

Friday May 14th
 This day fair weather
 watches employed boiling
 out the whale saw in
 course of the day four whales
 going to the sunward
 fine weather wind N.W.
 land 30 miles distant

Saturday May 15th
 Begins with thick
 weather Last part of the day
 fine weather employed in boiling
 saw the land to the north

Sunday May 16th
 Fine weather this
 24 hours also finished boiling
 the whale saw in course
 of the day 5 whales lowered
 the boats without success
 land near by so ends the day
