Monday May 17th

Begins with

the ship and cut him in
land 40 miles distant

Tuesday May 18th

commenced with

in boiling out the whale
Coopers setting up new casks
Last part boiling fine weather

Wednesday May 19th

This day begins
with fair weather spoke
Bargue Ripple of N London
Last part of the day saw whales
Lowered the boats and the
Waist Boatsteerer missed
a whale the consequence
was said Boatsteerer was deprived
of the berth and went
to live in the Forecastle

Thursday May 20th

This day begins with
Fine weather employed in
boiling out the whale
Last part of the day finished
boiling the whale also saw
4 ships as well as the land

Friday May 21st

This 24 hours blows
a fresh gale from S.W. & E
all hands employed in stowing
down oil and chocking
off the main hatch
thus ends this 24 hours

Sunday May 23rd

This day begins
with fine weather stood in
with the ship near Cape Fairweather
but saw no whales
Last part calm
