Saturday June 12th

Begins with fine weather
Saw Mount Juvvweather bearing
N by W 50 miles dist
Last part of the day thick weather

Sunday June 13th

Begins with blowing
at fresh gale from N.E. and
thick weather made all sail
and steered off before the wind
heading N.W. Last part of the
day thick weather Ship bound
to the westward carrying 100000 lbs

Monday June 14th

Begins with strong
winds from S.E. steering
N.W. Last part of the 24 hours
thick & rainy weather

Tuesday June 15th

Begins with light
winds from the Southward
Ship making the best of her way
to the westward
Last part of the day saw
Roes Island also saw two
whales Lowered the Boats
Struck one killed and sunk him
Likewise saw Ship Unceas
and bought a new whale Boat
from her

Wednesday June 16th

This 24 hours
Saw Montague Island
Also saw two whales Lowered
the Boats struck one and drenched
fine weather as ends this day
