moderate weather steering N.W.
Lat 66° 32'

Wednesday Aug 11th

This 24 hours
Begin with light winds
from the South crew employed
bailing out the whale
Last part fresh breeze steering N.W.
Lat 67° 48'

Thursday Aug 12th

Begin with calm
weather and thick fog
Last part light winds from
E.S.E. steering Ship N.E.

Friday Aug 13th

Begin with strong
winds from S.E. saw eight whales
bailing also saw Cape Lisburn
Last part of the day saw three
whales going fast towards the land

Saturday Aug 14th

This day begins with thick
weather Last part of the day
saw Cape Lisburn bearing South

Sunday Aug 15th

This day saw whales
Lowered the Boats and chased
without success Cape Lisburn 30 miles dist

Monday Aug 16th

This 24 hours
saw several whales Lowered
the Boats and took too to the Ship
and cut them in
Land 20 miles distant bearing S by W

Tuesday Aug 17th

Fine weather
employed in bailing out
the two whales Cooper employed
setting up casks
Cape Lisburn 25 miles Dist
so ends this day

Wednesday Aug 18th

This day begins with fine
weather employed in bailing
out the two whales
Last part of the day thick weather

Thursday Aug 19th

This 24 hours employed
in bailing also spoke Barge passing
Cape Lisburn 25 miles dist
saw four whales lowered
the Boats without success
