

Friday Sept 24th

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the South Ship under short sail Last part of the day fresh gales and thick weather.

Saturday Sept 25th

Begins with strong winds from S.W. Last part of the day Cape Lisburn bearing N.W. 30 miles distant fine weather wind N.W. Ship steering S.W. Thus ends the 25th

Sunday Sept 26th

This day strong Gale from S.W. steering S.W. at dark Cape East bearing S.E. 15 miles distant Ship Goethe Bound through the Straits with a fresh Gale from S.W. steering S.E. by E to clear the Cape also one of the men forward by the name of Clement Bowman has symptoms of the Scurvy

Monday Sept 27th

Begins with fresh winds from the north at daylight Cape East bore S.W. 30 miles distant Last part of the day light winds from the Eastward

Tuesday Sept 28th

Begins with strong winds from the South Ship by the wind on different tacks Latter part foggy weather wind from the South

Wednesday Sept 29th

This 24 hours fresh winds from the Southward Ship on different tacks between St Lawrence Island and Cape Chaplin thick weather and fresh winds from the South so ends this day

Thursday Sept 30th

Begins with strong winds and thick fog wind from the South Last part of the day saw Cape Chaplin two miles distant tacked Ship and stood towards St Lawrence Island at dark found the Ship near said Island
