Begins with fresh winds from S.W. steering S.E. Last part of the day moderate weather crew employed in boiling out the whale Mr Crawford proves to be below as usual when ever there is boiling to do

Saturday Oct 9th

Begins with fair weather wind to the north steering Ship S.E. watches employed boiling latter part of the 24 hours blowing fresh from S.W. also finished boiling out the whale

Sunday Oct 10th

This 24 hours begins with blowing a gale of wind from S.W. latter part of the day blowing strong from the north and squally weather Mr Crawford still below pleading sickness

Monday Oct 11th

Begins with blowing strong from S.W. all hands employed storing down oil Last part of the day strong winds ship under short sail

Tuesday Oct 12th

This 24 hours fresh winds from S.W. all hands storing down oil Saw several Finback whales in course of the day Mr Crawford once more to duty

Wednesday Oct 13th

This 24 hours begins with light air from S.E. Last part of the day calm weather saw the Land bearing S.E.

Begins with fresh gales from S.E. steering N.W. Last part of the day blowing a gale from the same quarter steering Ship N.W.
