Corns with strong gales from NW^W making to under a close reefed main top sail employing balling middle part the same latter part more moderate made sail at 2 m. coaled down

Lat 45 = 00 S
Long 145 = 27 W

Sunday

Corns with brisk winds from NW^W on the northern tack at sun down were ship to S^W and took in sail with wind in sight middle part the same latter part wind S^W

Lat 44 = 44 S
Long 146 = 16 W

No 14

Monday

Corns with brisk winds from NW^W heaving to SE^E under double reefed top sails at sun down took in sail wind S^W head S^{SE} middle and latter part fine

Lat 44 = 41 S
Long 146 = 24 W

Tuesday

Corns with brisk winds from SW spoke ship franklin of new bedford and bark terror of hobart town middle part the same latter part strong winds from NW under double reefed top sails

Lat 44 = 56 S
Long 146 = 12 W

Wednesday

Corns with strong gales from NW employed repairing sails middle part the same latter part thick weather and light winds from NW^W

Thursday

Corns with light winds and thick weather from NW^W employed repairing sails middle and latter part light winds and thick weather from NW^W to N

No 18

Friday

Corns with light winds and thick rainy weather from NW^W to N at 4 pm took in sail middle and latter part light winds and thick rainy weather from E

No 19

Saturday

Corns with light winds and thick rainy weather from E middle and latter part strong gales from S on the western tack.

Lat 45 = 13 S
Long 147 = 00 W

No 20

Sunday

Corns with strong gales from S heaving to NW^W under a double reefed main top sail and fore sail middle and latter part light winds from S

Tuesday

Corns with light winds from S heaving to NW^W under all sail middle part the same latter part light winds from E S E steering S^W
