

Tuesday June 11th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze from the E. latter part cloudy with a strong breeze at about 10 o'clock, raised blackfish lowered and chased but got none. So ends this 24 hours.

Latitude 39° 00
Longitude 53° 10 off

Wednesday June 12th
1833

First part of this 24 hours fine breeze from the W. and a powerful rain latter part clear and calm all hands employed in ships duty.

Thursday June 13th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze from the W. saw several Finbacks Whales, So ends this 24 hours.

Latitude - 38° 10
Longitude 44° 30

Friday June 14th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a strong breeze from the West all hands employed in ships duty.

Saturday June 15th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze from the W. at 10 o'clock, lowered for blackfish but did not get any. So ends these 24 hours.

Latitude 38° 10
Longitude 38° 00 off

Sunday June 16th
1833.

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze from the S.W. at 6 a.m. set fore topmast steering sail. So ends this 24 hours.

Lat 37 1/2
Long --- 34° 00

Monday June 17th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a strong breeze from the S.W. all drawing sail set at 12 o'clock made the Island of Flores ahead stood under the lee of the Island and hove too at 6 o'clock. Spoke Ship Fame of Nantucket 3 weeks out no oil. So ends this 24 hours.

Tuesday June 18th
1833.

First part of this 24 hours foggy went on shore at Sant Louis and got some recruits spoke ship Chilwood of N Bedford one month out no oil. So ends this 24 hours.

Wednesday June 19th
1833

First part of this 24 hours calm all hands employed in ships duty &c.

Thursday June 20th
1833

This 24 hours fine and almost calm at 4 P.M. lowered the boats and pulled for pleasure all hands employed in ships duty.

Friday June 21th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze from E. Fayal and St. George in sight bearing E by S. distant 50 miles off.

Saturday June 22th
1833.

This 24 hours fine a strong breeze from the E. Graciaoia bearing W. E. distant 40 miles saw 1 Fin-back Whale so ends this 24 hours off.

Sunday June 23rd
1833

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze from the E. at 6 P.M. spoke and boarded the Emerald of N Bedford 4 weeks no oil so ends this 24 hours. Fayal bearing E. distant 15 miles Pico bearing S.E. distant 20 miles a ship in sight.

Monday June 24th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze from the S.E. rigged out our fly jib-boom and bent the sail at the end of this 24 hours Fayal bears W. distant 20 miles Pico S.W. distant 30 miles St. George S.E. distant 10 miles Graciaoia W. E. distant 15 miles.

Tuesday June 25th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a strong breeze from all hands employed in working ship and looking out for whale but saw none. So ends this 24 hours off.
