

Friday July 12th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a strong breeze
from the W. E. all hands employed
in Ship's Duty Lat 30° 00
Long 23° 00

Saturday July 13th
1833

This 24 hours squally with strong
trades course South
Lat 24° 24
Long 22° 00

Sunday July 14th
1833

This 24 hours fine with strong winds
at 5 A. M. passed a Barque Ship standing
to S. W. Lat 22° 00
Long 20° 00

being about 100 miles from the Coast of
Arabia at Sunset took in sail but the
Cap. sails wore Ship and stood to the
Northward

Monday July 15th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a strong breeze
saw nothing till 5 P. M. then I raised
sperm Whales lowered all 4 boats
at 6 P. M. the Starboard got fast and
killed a 40 lb Whale and took him
alongside Lat 20° 05
Long 31° 00

Tuesday July 16th
1833

This 24 hours fine cut in our Whale and
got through at 4 P. M. wore Ship stood
to the East and got the works agoing
Lat 20° 00
Long 20° 30

Wednesday July 17th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a strong breeze
from the W. all hands employed
in Boiling Lat 19° 30

Thursday July 18th
1833

This 24 hours fine finished boiling
having turned up 40 lb Oil (Sperm)
Lat 17° 40

Friday July 19th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze
from the North saw nothing all
hands employed in cleaning Ship
Lat 16° 30

Saturday July 20th

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze
the S. W. course West for St. Nicholas
where we can head Lat 16° 40

Sunday July 21th
1833

This 24 hours Calm it being Sunday
all hands in idleness caught some
Dolphins and made a chowder for tea
Lat 16° 40

Monday July 22th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze
from the East all hands employed at
stowing down Oil Lat 16° 40

Tuesday July 23th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze
from the E. About 10 A. M. made
the Island of Bonavista one of the
Cape de Verde Course S. S. E. for St. Nicholas

Wednesday July 24th
1833

This 24 hours fine with a light breeze
from the E. at 10 A. M. made the
Isle of May ran in and landed at night
brought of a boat Load of Vegetables

Thursday July 25th
1833

This 24 hours squally with a strong breeze
from the W. W. at 4 A. M. again
went on shore and spent the day got
a boat Load of goats and hogs and got
in board and made all sail
for Cape Horn
