

Sunday Sept 5th
1833

First part of these 24 hours light winds from South and thick weather. At 1 P. M. spoke Ship's Delta of Greenport no Oil and Acasta with 4 whales latter part wind changed to N. W. and blew a severe gale land bearing S. E. distant 8 miles it was with much difficulty we succeeded in weathering it
Lat 37° 13'

Monday Sept 6th
1833

First part of these 24 hours light winds and fair weather latter part winds from the S. S. W. very strong — succeeded in beating up to the Island spoke ship George Porter no Oil had lost a boats crew we reported her ever being ashore on the Island

Tuesday Sept 10th
1833

First part of these 24 hours fine weather we ran in to the land lowered 3 boats Mr. Howland killed one and had to cut Capt Howland sunk his 70th whale. latter part squally, So Ends this unlucky day

Wednesday Sept 11th
1833

All these 24 hours squally with rain saw a ship's boat turn up a whale but lost him spoke ship Hercules of New Bedford it came on a gale did not go aboard land bearing W. distant 15 m

Thursday Sept 12th
1833

All these 24 hours a severe gale from the West Wind killed a pig So Ends these 24 hours Land S. W. Distant 50 Miles

Friday Sept 13th
1833

All these 24 hours light breezes from the S. at 5 O'clock P. M. raised Whales lowered our boats and galled them Land bearing S. W. distant 30 miles So Ends the days & Weeks and Months

Saturday Sept 14th
1833

All these 24 hours fine ran in to the land and went on shore caught some fish & saw Edw — shearman and others spoke Ship Marcia of Fairhaven & George Porter of New Bedford

Sunday Sept 15th
1833

These 24 hours light breezes from the West saw several Whales but got none

Monday Sept 16th
1833

All these 24 hours strong Winds from the North at 9 A. M. — concluded to go to the Eastward and put away in company with ship Hercules under doubled reef top Sails

Tuesday Sept 17th
1833

First part of these 24 hours a gale from the S. W. latter part more moderate Course S. W. E

Wednesday Sept 18th
1833

All these 24 hours fine weather unbent the foresail and mended it at 2 P. M. went on board the Hercules and spent the afternoon

Thursday Sept 19th
1833

All these 24 hours fine weather with light winds spoke Ship Ann Maria New London 4th Oil
Lat — 34° 40' S
Long — 71° 10' W
