1833

1833

These 24 hours fine weather with light winds from the S.S.E. saw Finbacks

Monday Sept 23th
1833

all these 24 hours fine weather with light winds from the N. all hands mending sails

Tuesday Sept 24th
1833

These 24 hour commences with a fine breeze from the S.W. broke out in the after Hatch way for Bread Beef & Pork

Wednesday Sept 25th
1833

all these 24 hours fine weather with wind from the N. N. W. saw Finbacks
Lat 31° 30'

Thursday Sept 26th
1833

These 24 hours fine weather fresh gale from S.W. saw Finbacks spoke the Hercules Lat 31° 00'

Friday Sept 27th
1833

all these 24 hours fine weather saw Ship Elm Maria to the Leeward So Ends the 24 hours

Fine weather these 24 hours went on board the Hercules saw Finbacks and Humpbacks

These 24 hours fine weather Wood caught a Porpoise so we had some fresh meat for Sea Course S.E. off

all these 24 hours strong breezes from the N. N. W. Course E. by S

These 24 hours fine weather saw Finbacks & Humpbacks saw 3 ships

Friday Oct 4th
1833

These 24 hours fine saw many Finbacks fresh breezes from the West

Saturday Oct 5th
1833

all these 24 hours fine weather Calm at 5 a. M. saw whales lowered and took a small Whale to Mr. Howland boat. Hercules took one the same time
