1833

all these 24 hours fresh gales from
the West and a heavy sea saw
Whales lowered twice without success

Monday Oct 7th
1833

First part of these 24 hours fresh winds
from the W. W. latter part squally
saw nothing this day 2 Ships in sight

Lat by Ob 32° 25'
Long - 12° 30'

Tuesday Oct 8th
1833

All these 24 hours strong
breezes from the North

Lat 32° 37'

Wednesday Oct 9th
1833

All this 24 hour strong
breezes and no Whales

Lat 33° 00'

Thursday Oct 10th
1833

This 24 hour fine at 5 P.M.
raised Whales lowered and
killed 3 and got 2 of them to the
Ship about 10 O'clock

Lat 32° 50'
Long 12° 00'

Friday Oct 11th
1833

This 24 hour commences with
strong winds cut in one of our
Whales and got to boiling it being
so rugged to cut in the other
So end this day

Saturday Oct 12th
1833

This 24 hour cut in our other
Whale saw no whales this day
So end the 24 hours

Sunday Oct 13th
1833

This 24 hour thick foggy weather
finished boiling &c at 5 P.M.
Spoke Ship *Creasta* of London
2 Whales

Monday Oct 14th
1833

This 24 hour fine at 5 P.M.
Spoke Ship *Grand Turk* Edg
wanting 2 Whales to fill up let
her have provisions and put letters
on board saw Whales but got none

Lat 32° 00'

Tuesday Oct 15th
1833

This 24 hours fine saw Whales
but got none

Lat 32° 44'

Wednesday Oct 16th
1833

This 24 hour fine got a Whale
to the bow boat and cut her in

Lat 32° 46'

Thursday Oct 17th
1833

This 24 hour Calm lowered the
Boats and pulled about 2 miles
and got a whale to the Waist
Boat

Friday Oct 18th
1833

This 24 hour fine got a Whale
to the Waist Boat

Lat 32° 35'

Saturday Oct 19th
1833

This 24 hours fine all hands
employed in boiling saw no
Whales Spoke the *Grand Turk*
wanting no Whales

Sunday Oct 20th
1833

This 24 hours strong breeze from
the S.W. all hands employed in
boiling saw no Whales

Lat 33° 00'
Long 12° 00'
