Friday Nov 8th
1833

This 24 hours good Weather saw plenty
of Whales chased all day at 5 o'clock got
a Whale to the Bow Boat

Saturday Nov 9th
1833

This 24 hour fine got a Whale
to the Larboard Boat

Jones of St. London 9 Whales

Monday Nov 11th
1833

This 24 hours fine Weather saw Whales
but got none

Tuesday Nov 12th
1833

This 24 hours got 10 Whales all
hands busily employed in boiling
and storing down

Wednesday Nov 13th
1833

This 24 hours good Weather got
a Whale Hoko Ship George of
Dartmouth 800 lb Sperm 400 Whales

Lat 32° 40'

Thursday Nov 14th
1833

This 24 hours cut in 2 Whales got
another alongside and stored 1000 lb
of Oil down great day Work

Friday Nov 15th
1833

This 24 hours fine Weather cut in
a Whale Mate of Duby with sore
eyes

Saturday Nov 16th
1833

This 24 hours a Gale all hands
employed in Boiling & Storing

Sunday Nov 17th
1833

This 24 hours a Continued Gale
all hands employed in Boiling & Storing

Monday Nov 18th
1833

This 24 hours Strong Winds got
a Whale to the Waist Boat
Saw a Ship with a Black Ball
in her Fore Topsail

Tuesday Nov 19th
1833

This 24 hours a gale from the
S. W. All hands employed in
boiling and storing down

Wednesday Nov 20th
1833

This 24 hours almost Calm saw
2 Whales lowered but got none
Saw the George of Dartmouth got
a Whale to the Windard
Lat 33° 39'

Thursday Nov 21th
1833

This 24 hours saw Whales lowered
the 3 Larboard Boats but did
not get fast at the same time
raised another Whale lowered
pulled on to him Boatsteers saw
missed him

Lat 33° 00'
