1834

These 24 hours light breeze and a heavy swell commenced Boiling saw whales chased without success

Wednesday Jan 22nd

These 24 hours rugged saw no whales finished Boiling Bleeding to the E. W.

Thursday Jan 23rd

These 24 hours fine weather with a light breeze from the West set all sail and started to the North at 12 O'clock raised Whales lowered the Boats and took one to the Waist Boat

Friday Jan 24th

These 24 hours almost calm at 9 A. M. raised a Whale 4 miles to the windward of the ship lowered the Boats and took him to the Waist Boat (Cold and Chilly)

Saturday Jan 25th

These 24 hours rugged all hands employed in Boiling and Stowing down saw a ship to the leeward

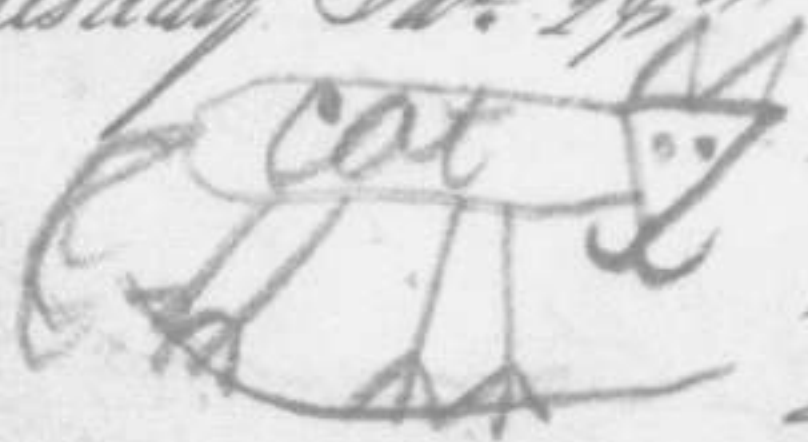
Sunday Jan 26th

These 24 hours strong Breezes finished Stowing down raised Whales chased without success Cold Weather.

Monday Jan 27th

These 24 hours strong Breezes Spike Ship Gave of Sagarhar 3 Whales but 1 Whale

Tuesday Jan 28th



First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze raised Whales lowered the Boats Larboard Boat got fast and killed one and sunk him latter part a gale this winds up our fishing sank the first and last
Lat 42° 10'

Wednesday Jan 29th

These 24 hours a gale from the West saw a ship to the Windward a Boiling proved to be the Hannibal
Lat 41° 55'
Long 5° 30'

Thursday Jan 30th

These 24 hours moderated but thick and rainy saw nothing broke the band to the main yard and mended it

Friday Jan 31st

First part of these 24 hours light winds from the W. S. W. latter part strong gales and rainy

Saturday Feb 1st

These 24 hours strong winds Spike Ship Hannibal of Sagarhar 1000 Bbls of Oil
Lat 41° 40'

Sunday Feb 2nd

These 24 hours strong winds saw a whale going quick
Lat 41° 28'
Long by Lunar 4° 49'

Monday Feb 3rd

These 24 hours fine with a light breeze from the West Course E. S. E. in company with the Hannibal

Tuesday Feb 4

These 24 hours rugged saw one Whale lowered the boats but did not get him Spike Ship Gave with 3 whales
Lat 41° 55'

Wednesday Feb 5

These 24 hours strong winds from the S. S. W. saw nothing sent up our Mission Top Sallant yard and sail
Lat 41° 49'
Long by Lunar 6° 30'
