Remarks Thursday Oct 3rd 58 days out

Light breeze from westward heading up for the town at 10 AM. Boat went on shore & carried tobacco & the flour &c at 4 PM. boat came off with 16 hogs & wind on shore again & came off at sunset 10 more hogs & brought the Capt. made sail & stood out heading south

Remarks on board Friday Oct 4th
light breeze from S. & E. steering by the wind with starboard tacks aboard employed in breaking out and coopers bread

Remarks Saturday Oct 5th 59
light breeze from N. & E. steering south by E. employed in breaking out and coopers bread saw 3 sails

Remarks on board Sunday Oct 6th
light breeze from N. W. steering south spoke a bark bound to Liverpool from Calcutta saw 5 sails

Remarks Monday Oct 7th 60 days out
light breeze from south & west wind steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard saw 15 sails spoke the Montreal of New Bedford 3 months out with 1902 m

Remarks Tuesday Oct 8th
fore part light breeze from Eastward steering south by E. latter part squally with rain set studding sails and entered Port

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Remarks on board Wednesday Oct 9th 61

Moderate breeze from Eastward steering by the wind with the starboard a board 6 sails in sight at sunset squally with rain

Remarks Thursday Oct 10th 62
fore part calm latter part squally with rain saw 5 sails

Remarks Friday Oct 11th 63

Light breeze from westward steering south latter part some rain spoke the Montreal

Remarks Saturday Oct 12th 64
light breeze from westward steering south & west, lowered for N. B. look for but did not get fast Montreal in sight

Remarks on board Sunday Oct 13th
fore part light breeze from N. & W. steering westward latter part strong breeze heading southeast saw the Montreal

Remarks Monday Oct 14th 65
fore part strong breeze from N. steering by the wind with starboard tacks aboard latter part tacked ship saw three sails

Remarks on board Tuesday Oct 15th
strong breeze from southward heading to windward saw 4 sails
