Remarks Thursday Jan 14th 1851

Having been from NW by steering by
lat 45° 45' the wind on different tacks saw a large whale
long 57' 30" but he was killed so bad that we did not
take him along side spoke the St George
boiling had taken 4 whales since we saw
her last

Remarks Friday Jan 15th 1851
Strong breeze from Westward steering
by the wind on different tacks on board
saw two seals

Remarks Saturday Jan 16th 1851
Strong breeze from Westward steering
by the wind on different tacks saw nothing

Remarks Sunday Jan 17th 1851
Strong breeze from Westward steering
by the wind on different tacks for
the most part foggy saw nothing

Remarks Monday Jan 18th 1851
Very part strong breeze from the
Westward, little part foggy breeze
spoke the bark Andrew of W.T.
with 130 men saw nothing sent
down main top sail and rigged
a fore jack

Remarks Tuesday Jan 19th 1851
Strong breeze from Westward steering
by the wind on different tacks
spoke the barque of W.T. Capt Clark
also the St George of W.T. at 4.24 long 57.15

Remarks Wednesday Jan 20th 1851
Strong breeze from Westward steering
by the wind on different tacks
spoke the bark of W.T. at 4.24 long 57.15

Remarks Thursday Jan 16th 1851

Moderate breeze from Westward
steering by the wind on different
fore part employed in cutting in
latter part raised whale flound
but did not get fast

Remarks Friday Jan 17th 1851

Moderate breeze from Westward
steering to the NE eastward
employed in trying out
saw nothing

Remarks Saturday Jan 18th 1851
Light breeze from Westward
steering on different tacks saw
nothing finished boiling about
7 PM turned up 8 o'clock

Remarks Sunday Jan 19th 1851
Light breeze from NW & Northward
steering by the wind on different
tacks spoke the Messenger & the Gen
der at 9 PM spoke the George Washington
& Warsaw bound for Cape Horn

Remarks Monday Jan 20th 1851
Light breeze from the Westward being
for the most part all day employed in
stowing down sail

Remarks Tuesday Jan 21st 1851
Fore part mounted breeze from Northward
steering by the wind on different
tacks spoke the Amethyst
at 11 PM Cape Howe latter part
thick fog set up most of the day
at sunset took in sail
