Remarks on board Jan 22nd 1860 day
Moderate breeze from southward
steering to westward. No ship or thing
could sail.

Remarks Thursday Jan 23rd 1860
Very light calm. After rain
light breeze from N.W. during the day
saw nothing.

Remarks Friday Jan 24th 1860
Light breeze from N.W. steering
to westward. Saw a carcass.

Remarks Saturday Jan 25th 1860
Moderate breeze from N.W. steering
to westward. Light wind. Saw nothing.

Remarks Sunday Jan 26th 1860
Light breeze from N.W. steering
to westward. Saw nothing.

Remarks Monday Jan 27th 1860
Moderate breeze from southward
steering to westward. For the most part foggy.
Saw nothing.

Remarks Tuesday Jan 28th 1860
Light breeze from all points. For compass
course N.W. steering to westward. For part foggy.
Saw nothing.

Remarks Wednesday Jan 29th 1860
Strong breeze from N.W. all this day
steering to westward. Saw two sails.
Saw a ship.

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Remarks on board Thursday Jan 30th 1860
Strong breeze from N.W. steering to
westward. Saw Staten Island
about 4 P.M. at 7 reefed topsail.

Remarks on board Jan 31st 1860
Blowing a gale from N.W. steering to
westward. Closed reefed main topsail
for top mast stay sail & spencers.

Remarks Friday Feb 1st 1860
Blowing at gale from south &
westward with snow. Steering to
about S.W. saw a ship standing
on starboard tack.

Remarks Sunday Feb 3rd 1860
Strong breeze from southward
steering to westward. Wind on starboard
tack with double reefed topsails &
1 courses. Saw two sails.

Remarks Monday Feb 4th 1860
Light breeze from southward with a snow
well steering N.W. saw Staten
Island and sea cutter.

Remarks Tuesday Feb 5th 1860
Moderate breeze from westward steering
to windward. Saw nothing.

Remarks Wednesday Feb 6th 1860
Light breeze from N.W. steering to
windward. Saw a small ship.

Remarks Thursday Feb 7th 1860
Strong breeze from westward steering
to northward. Saw Orizaba about 1 P.M.
