

Ship Cove Group Bound for Beringi Island

Remarks on board Sunday April 25th

One part light breeze from S.W. lying too under she reefed main topsail & started emptying in cooping & blowing down the deck at 7th finished stopping down set the foresail steering N. 2th W. latter part fresh breeze from westward steering N. 2th W. saw a sail

Monday April 26th

One part fresh breeze from westward steering N. 2th W. saw three sails at 4 P.M. raised right top sails lowered & point boat struck & broke the first iron & spars shot warp boat came on board & placed forward steering by the point latter part light breeze from eastward steering to N. & westward at 10 A.M. lowered lower right whale but did not get near them lat 53° 05' N saw 2 sail

Tuesday April 27th

One part light breeze from westward steering N. 2th W. with some snow saw nothing latter part light breeze from eastward heading N. N. E. lowered for right whales lat 56° 21' N

Wednesday April 28th

One part strong breeze from N. N. W. westward heading N. N. E. saw 2 ships latter part strong breeze from westward lat 57° 28' N

Thursday April 29th

One part fresh breeze from S. W. heading N. 2th W. saw 2 ships latter part strong breeze with snow & fog jammed with 2 Frenchmen employed in mending fore topmast strutting sail

Friday April 30th

One part strong breeze from S. W. heading N. 2th W. with some snow latter part fresh breeze from S. W. lying too under short sail with thick snow storm

Remarks on board Saturday May 1st

One part strong breeze from S. W. lying too under short sail in thick snow storm saw nothing latter part strong breeze steering N. 2th W. saw 3 sails

Sunday May 2nd

One part strong breeze from S. W. spoke the Washington of Gay Harbor & the Enterprise of New Bedford at 7 P.M. took in fore & mizzen top sail blowing a gale with a plenty snow latter part strong gale from S. W. lying too

Monday May 3rd

One part strong gale from S. W. heading N. 2th W. saw a ship to windward latter part fresh breeze with heavy snow at 10 A.M. saw a dead whale lowered & took him along side & commenced cutting saw 2 ships

Tuesday May 4th

One part fresh breeze from S. W. at 6 P.M. finished cutting & cleared up decks & commenced boiling took out 6 iron belonging to the India & 3 belonging to the Florida of N. B. latter part all hands employed in boiling jammed with the Hiburnia of N. B. left at 10 P.M.

Wednesday May 5th

Light breeze from S. W. steering N. E. & P. all hands boiling jammed with the brigard of Gay Harbor to ships in sight latter part light breeze from southward steering N. 2th W. saw 2 ships watch employed in boiling

Thursday May 6th

Light breeze from southward watch employed in boiling jammed with the Arab of Fair Haven at 7 P.M. finished boiling latter part all hands employed in stowing down saw land
