Remarks Friday June 4th 1853

The port fresh breeze from S. E. steering away
 the passage into the Ochoa Sea entered the
 sea about 11 to 12 saw 2 ships latter part
 fresh breeze with fog steering N. W. spoke the
 Ferdinand of Castile under foremast standing
 sail & with latter

Saturday June 5th

You find fresh bugs from D. W. Sturges
 N. H. & N. E. in breaking out of
 water later part moderate bugs from D. W. Sturges
 N. H. saw the President

Sunday June 6th

One part moderate breeze from eastward
stirring N by W. with snow & fog
better part light breeze from eastward heading
N by W.

Monday June 1st

You start strong large calm New grasses
 rather not fresh breeze from southward strong
 N. by E. breeze for a right while

Friday June 8th

W. Bone flat, strong large string 18 1/2 lbs. 110000
 huffe too with head bone back & double refect topss
 better part strong, here with bog 11 1/2 lbs. 110000

Wednesday June 9

Large port light, breeze with fog, steering NW
 latter part, moderate breeze, with some
 fog. saw 3 ships hove in for a Bow head

Thursday 15th

One port high breeze with thick fog & rain
 latter part thick fog with jammed with the
 boats of N. before I left this season

Remarks Friday May 11th 1852

light breeze from S. & eastward with fog &
rain latter part fresh breeze with thick fog

Saturday May 18

One part strong breeze from southward with the
fog up to the Three Brothers of Nantucket & gammed
with General like at 2 PM. lowered for a bowhead
after night breeze lowered for a bow head with
faint light & one of her boats struck & turned her in
the saw land

Sunday May 12

One pint very light breeze gammed with the
Metacomb & St George saw nothing better but
fresh breeze with thick fog gammed with the Ohio
of New Bedford & mouth out with 240//

Monday May 1st

You sent fresh breeze with fog, jammed with
 Ohio latter part strong breeze from N &
 eastward saw the land.

Wesley May 15

11
The post strong breeze from N.E. fresh-
ing eastward with fog & rain latter.
No fresh breeze stood in for the land & sent 3 boats in
gamined with the Kentonville of Cold Spring
lat 58:45' N. W. D.

Wednesday Mar 16th

Thursday May 16th
 One part fresh breeze with some rain Wind off
 on for the boat saw the Chariot cutting a wheel
 at 6 P.M. boats came off saw nothing
 latter part thick fog

Thursday May 15th

One port light burst with shot & she went down
again top sail & masted it & bent it again
tatter & light burst with shot & ran stony
westward. saw a ship.
