

Ship Gov. Brown Bound for Cape Horn

Remarks *Friday Feb 6th*
Light breeze from E by S heading N by E
at 11 A.M. took ship heading S at
8 P.M. the Cooper was taken again vomiting
blood & expired at 20 minutes past P.

Monday Feb 7th
Fresh breeze from Eastward steering
S by E at 1 P.M. buried the Cooper
lat 35° 21'

Tuesday Feb 8th
Fresh breeze from E by N heading
S by E & broke out for water lat 37° 22'

Wednesday Feb 9th
Strong breeze from E by S heading
S by E at 1 P.M. took in light sail & double
reefed at 6 close reefed fore & main top
sails took in main sail & jib lat 39° 21'

Thursday Feb 10th
Strong breeze from S by E heading
S by E turned out reef set main sail
& jib broke out (mist) S by E set main top
gallant sail lat 40° 47'

Friday Feb 11th
Strong breeze from E by S heading
S by E at 5 P.M. with hauled to S
to Eastward took ship heading E by N
set up topmast & top gallant (back stay)
lat 41° 37'

Saturday Feb 12th
Fresh breeze from S by E heading
E by N & saw Manxporos lat 41° 00'

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Remarks of the day *Sunday Feb 13th*
Fresh breeze from S by E heading
E by N at 5 A.M. took ship heading
S by E at 6 took again heading S by E
at 1 P.M. took heading S by E

Monday Feb 14th
Moderate breeze from Eastward
heading S by E set up the masting clew
& fly by jib guys broke head sail for part

Tuesday Feb 15th
Moderate breeze from N by E by E heading
S by E saw finbacks lat 44° 10' S

Wednesday Feb 16th
Fresh breeze from N by E steering E by S
saw nothing lat 45° 40' S

Thursday Feb 17th
Fresh breeze from North steering East
foggy with some rain latter part
steering E by N

Friday Feb 18th
Moderate breeze from N by N steering
East latter part steering E by S
long 131° 50' lat 47° 19' S

Saturday Feb 19th
Fresh breeze passing from S by E
to S by N with rain steering N by N
lat 47° 50' long 128° 21'

Sunday Feb 20th
Strong breeze from N by N steering
E by N employed in chocking
in lower hold lat 47° 37' long 128° 31'
