Remarks of the day April 26th
Light breeze from S.W. steering
N.W. by N. employed in scraping old iron
& the whaling casks & painting at lat 27° 58'
long 67° 01' saw 2 albatrosses

Remarks Wednesday 27th
Fresh breeze from N.W. steering
N.W. by N. employed in scraping &
painting old iron at 30° 25' long 68° 00'

Thursday April 28th
A fair strong breeze from N.W. by
W. took the gallant sails, steering N.W. by W.
at 5 wind hauled N.W. heading N.W. by
W. down the track, at 6 P.M. heading N.W. by
W. spoke the first Ocean Bird of New York town.
Took a boat, & went on board of
her & got some fish, lat 32° 36' long 68° 33'

Friday April 29th
Light breeze from Northward, &
standing in different tacks employed
in scraping & varnishing the Capstan &
Wheel at lat 32° 05' long 68° 52'

Saturday April 30th
Fresh breeze from Northward standing
N.W. by W. saw 2 sails, lat 33° 21' long 68° 51'

Sunday May 1st
Strong breeze from N.W. heading N.W. by
W. took in light sails & double reefed fore &
mizen top sails. At 10 set main top gallant
sail, saw a whaling boat bound home
heading N.W. by W. lat 34° 54' long 71° 34'

Remarks of the day Monday May 2nd
A fair strong breeze from N.W. by
W. heading N.W. by W. at 3 P.M. long 72° 01'

Tuesday May 3rd
At 6 A.M. wind hauled to
E.S.E. light breeze steering N.W. by
W. wind hauled N.W. by W. with
strong breeze steering North at 4 P.M.
sounded but got no bottom, lat 36° 47' long 71° 58'

Wednesday May 4th
A.M. strong breeze from N.W. by
W. steering North at 2 P.M. wind hauled
to Eastward with fog steering N.W. by
W. spoke a Dutch Ed. Boat from Rotterdam
bound to Philadelphia with a cargo
of gin & herring at 8 P.M. fog cleared up
lat 37° 24' long 72° 00'

Thursday 5th
A fair strong breeze from N.W. by
W. steering N.W. by W. at 12 P.M. thick fog
lifting at 12:30, at 1 P.M. steering
N.W. by W. at 4 P.M. spoke Dutch Island East
point bearing N.W. by W. dist 15 miles at
11 P.M. wind from S.W. heading S.E.

Friday May 6th
Strong breeze from N.W. by W. heading
to Westward. A fair strong breeze with fog
at 8 A.M. in for Block Island at 1 P.M.
a Bedford Whaler boat & took a pilot
standing Eastward
