sails double reefed the topsails at 6 PM
Moorat Mail sail 11 PM wind holding
to the E.S.E. Mast down yard at 12 PM
light set the foremast stunsail
at 4 am calm at 6 am light sail in
sight latter part Ends with Moorat sail

Thursday These 24 hours Commences with light wind
28. 1836 from the S.W. ship under all sail by
the wind crew employed on ships duty
at 7 PM took in the fore and mizen top galin
sail by flying jib ship heading S.W.
Middle part strong breeze and passing
clouds at 6 AM took ship to the W.S.W.
latter part strong breeze and cloudy So Ends
Lat By obs 41° 46'

Friday These 24 hours Commences with strong
July wind from the South and squally weather
the 29 ship under all heavy sail heading W.S.W.
at 2 PM Jackt ship to the E.S.E. at 6 PM
set the fore and mizen top galin sail at 8
PM Jackt ship to the S.W. Middle part
pleasant breezes and fair weather at 6 AM
saw sail in sight standing to the S.W.
latter part Moorat Lat By obs 41° 44'
