 Part Strong breeze at 2 P.M. Tuck in
 the main Toppail sail at 11 A.M. saw
 Night whale board three boats low
 Boat struck side and sunk under with
 Strong breeze and August saw ships in
 sight Latter By 40 37:25

On whaling Voyage 10. 1836

Saturday These 24 hours Commenced with strong
 Sept Breeze from the N.E. and cloudy, within
 the 10 Ship under all Sailing sail saw several
 whale at 4 P.M. (heard the water barrel
 Longboat struck and put there at 6 P.M. took
 37:47 up the Boats and shorten sail Ship
 headed to the westward and set the
 Longboat's Boats crew at midnight wore
 the 11 Ship to the N.W. at 4:30 A.M. set
 Double Reef Topsails at 7 A.M. saw whale
 fore Tugid to low at 9 A.M. took in the
 fore Topsail Latter Part heavy gale and
 Reef saw 50 Enies Latter By 40 - 37:57

Sunday These 24 hours Commenced with strong
 Sept Gale from the N.W. and heavy sea
 the 11 Thining Ship under Coast Red Main
 Long and 2 Mizzen Topsails heading S.W.
 40:17 at 12 Midnight wore ship. Northward
 at 6 A.M. main sail at 7 A.M. Tuck in
 fore and Mizzen Topsails Latter Part heavy
 squalls attended with showers of rain
 So ended these 24 hours Latter By 40 37:20

Monday These 24 hours Commenced with heavy
 Sept 12 Gale from the N.W. and squally
 Weather Ship lying low under Coast
 Longboat's main Toppail and fore and Mizzen topsails
 at 4 P.M. saw along ship running
 to the Eastward Head English hullars
 at 6 P.M. wore ship to the North took
 up the Starboard Boat Middle Part heavy
 squalls attended with rain at 4 A.M.
 Moon moderate at 5:30 A.M. main sail
 set Double Reef Topsails fore and Main
 at 7 A.M. set the main sail
 at 8 A.M. wore ship to westward
 Latter Part strong gale and heavy sea
 Latter By 40 37:12
