Friday These 24 hours Commences with
 strong breeze from the westward and
 the 7 thick weather ship headed to the ESE
 all hands employed in lowering down
 at 4 PM thick (wisley) at 6 PM let
 wash boat down at 10 PM saw a ship
 byling at 5 AM main sail and steered
 to the ESE all hands employed in cooping
 down taken in sight at 11 AM saw
 a ship standing to the SE latter part
 strong breeze latter by day 35.16

Saturday These 24 hours Commences with brisk
 gales from the westward and fair weather
 ship under all sails (Sparry) ship head
 to the southward at 2 PM spoke the ship
 name of Redford with fore whales
 long 70.09 at 4 PM saw whale land three boats
 did not strike at 6 PM shorten sail
 three ships in sight Middle Part
 fresh breeze at 5 AM main sail
 at 10 AM two sail in sight latter part
 strong breeze so ends latter by day 35.03

Sunday These 24 hours Commences with brisk
 breeze and cloudy weather ship under
 single reef topsails heading SEW
 at 4 PM saw one whale land three
 boats but did not strike at 6 PM
 fresh in sail ship heading to the
 long 70.17 to the SE at 11 PM wore ship to the
 east SEW at 5 AM main sail and
 wore ship to the SEW at 10
 AM saw one right whale
 at 11 AM wore ship to the SEW
 saw ships in sight
 at 12 noon wore ship to the SEW
 latter part fresh breeze
 latter by day

Monday These 24 hours Commences with fresh
 breeze from the SE ship under all
 sail (Sparry) fore whaling at one PM
 spoke the ship name of Redford
 and ship gorge of Redford with 3000
 barrels of oil at 5 PM saw two whales
 land three boats but did not strike
 at 8 PM took her to the ship
 at 9 PM shorten sail and let the wash
 ship head to the SEW at 4 AM land all
 hands at 5 AM began cutting at 8.30 finish
 cutting at 9 AM saw whales land three
 boats but did not strike and cut at the
 Meriden took her to the ship latter by day 35.16

Tuesday These 24 hours Commences with fresh
 breeze from the SE at one PM began cutting
 at 4 PM finish cutting shorten sail
 and began byling ship head SEW
 at 12 Midnight wore ship to the westward
 long 70.36 at 8 AM wore ship to the northward
 at 9 AM wore ship to the westward
 latter part strong gales and thick weather
 so ends these 24 hours latter by day 35.16

Wednesday These 24 hours begins with fresh gales
 away from the SE and thick weather
 the 12 ship under least reef main topsail
 and fore sail headed to the westward
 all hands employed on byling at 6 PM
 let the wash at 12 Midnight wore ship
 to the SE at 4 AM wore ship to the westward
 saw two whales land three boats but
 did not strike latter part strong gales
 from the SE at 12 Meriden took
 her to the fore sail
 so ends these 24 hours
 latter by day 35.17
