 squally with light showers of rain
 ship laying to under Cloast Reef
 Main Sapsail and fore sail at one
 PM saw a whale to the NW at 6 PM
 Cloast Reef the main Sapsail Middle
 Part strong gale at 8 AM moderate
 Main sail Latter By obs 34° 37

Saturday These 24 hours Commenced with
 day 5 brisk gales and cloudy weather ship
 the under all sails A Gray wack Emp
 loyed on ship duty at 2 PM Ciled
 the Pipe nothing in sight ship head
 West at 6:30 PM sunk in sail Middle
 Part light Breeze and cloudy weather
 at 4:30 AM main sail Stead NW
 saw a ship to the NW at 10 AM spoke
 the ship Eagle of Nantucket nine whale
 this before at 12 noon on bent the
 fore Sapsails to the fore Lat By obs 34° 49

Sunday These 24 hours Commenced with
 day 6 brisk Breeze from the NW ship
 head NW but all hands Employed
 on ship duty Repairing the fore topsail
 at 3 PM saw whale board three Bouts
 did not strike at 4 PM saw whale
 board the Bouts west boat struck and
 broad at 6:30 sunk in sail head
 NW but Middle Part strong gales
 at 4:30 let the fore sail at 12 AM
 finished mending the fore Sapsail
 Latter Part heavy gale Lat By obs 34° 36

Monday These 24 hours Commenced with
 day 7 heavy gale from the NW and thick
 weather ship lying low under
 Cloast Reef main Sapsail and fore
 sail at 5 PM sunk in the fore
 Long sail ship head NW Middle Part
 5 PM heavy gales and squally weather at 4:30
 AM let the fore sail at 7 AM
 were ship to the South at 9 AM
 11 AM ship NW saw several whale
 Latter Part strong gale
 so Ends these 24 hours Lat By obs 36° 01
