Tuesday These 24 hours Commenced
No. 8th With strong gales from the N.W. and
and heavy sea on ship lying low under
Closest reef main topsail and fore
sail at 5 P.M. more moderate ship
headed N.W. Middle Port light
Longitud Breaze and heavy sea at 4.30 am made
5.30 sail Bent the fore topsail and set dub
East reef topsail at 8 am set the main
sail three sail in sight at 9 am
saw whale at 10 am lower three boats
but did not strike latter Part strong
gales to Ende. Lat By obs 36° 38'

Wednesday
No. 9th These 24 hours Commenced with
strong gales from the N.W. and
squally weather ship under dub
reef topsails ship heaving on the
wind with the barbers backs aloft
at 3 P.M. spoke the ship consist of
barbers fore mast out with 2 whale
at 6 P.M. Tuck in sail head N.W. and one
ship in sight at 7 P.M. were ship to
westward at 12 Midnight were ship
to the N.E. one ship in sight at 5 am
made sail and stead S.E. with strong
Breaze and heavy weather latter thick
weather to Ende this 24 hours Lat By obs 36° 16'

Thursday
No. 10th These 24 hours Commenced with
strong gales from the N.W. and
smoky weather ship under all sail
Longitud Separary at 3 P.M. saw two whale Tuck
6.00 in the fore and Mizzen topsail and give
East at 5 P.M. saw four whale Closest
reef the Main topsail and lower two
Middle Port strong gales at 6 am
saw whale at 9 am tuck in the fore
sail latter Part Ende the same Lat By obs 36° 17'

Further Little Master 1836

Friday These 24 hours Commenced with
No. 11 strong gales from the N.W. and rough
sea at one P.M. stead of S.E. at 2.2
Longitud saw whale left tow to the S.E. and
6.00 in the fore sail at 6 P.M. were ship
East to the westward Middle Port light Breaze
at 5 am made sail and stead S.E. saw
several fin backs latter Part light
Breaze and fair weather Lat By obs 36° 03'

Saturday
No. 12th These 24 hours Commenced with
light Breaze from the S.W. and Pleasant
weather ship under all sail at one P.M.
saw whale at 3 P.M. lower three Boats
Bow boat struck and Cield along Cow
whale at 12 Midnight put her to the
ship Tuck in sail and set the wack
Calve at 4.30 am put Naily fore cutting
at 5 am began cutting at 9 am finished
cutting latter Part light Breaze and
Pleasant weather Lat By obs 34° 38'

Sunday
No. 13th These 24 hours Commenced with
Breaze and fair weather ship under
all sail one employed on Boiling
and fitting the boiler at 2 P.M. saw
whale lower three Boats waist boat
struck and broad Bow boat struck and
gut stove give the line to the waist
Boat and the Cield at 10 P.M. Tuck
the whale to the ship and tuck in sail
Middle Port Calve at 7 am began
cutting at 11 am finished cutting latter
Part fresh Breaze Lat By obs 34° 46'

Monday
No. 14th These 24 hours Commenced with fresh
Breaze from the Eastward at one P.
M. set the fore and mizzen topsail
dub reef all hands employed in work
