

P. The. Indian River 1836

Sunday These 24 hours commenced with
Dec 4 strong gales from the North and
 the thick weather ship under least
 full main topsail and fore sail
 headed S. E. at one P.M. Hazing built
 down at 4 P.M. set the weather again
 again at 5 P.M. wind held to the
 westward ship head S. W. Mid night
 more moderate finish. Hoisting
 at 5 A.M. made sail. Set double reef
 topsails and began stowing down at 11
 A.M. let all the reefs but the topsails
 and sail in sight. Lat 35° 02'

Monday These 24 hours commenced with
Dec 5 light breeze from the S.W. and rising
 cloudy ship under all sail. began all
 hands employed in stowing down at
 5.30 P.M. finish saw several fin backs
 at 6.30 Juck in the fore and mizzen
 topsail ship head W. B. N. Middle Part
 light breeze and Pleasant at 6 A.M.
 Hoisted sail at 6 A.M. saw several land
 three boats carbide boat struck and
 put stove bow lost Cild at 10 A.M.
 Juck her to the ship at 11 A.M. began
 cutting so ends these 24 hours Lat 35° 21'

Tuesday These 24 hours commenced with
Dec 6 fine weather and calm all hands
 employed in cutting at 3 P.M. finish
 6.4.38 saw sail in sight to the Southward
 at 4 P.M. Juck in sail and set
 back Hoisting Middle Part light breeze
 at 4 A.M. made sail and lead on the
 wind to the Eastward saw four many
 fin backs Latter Part finish breeze
 and fine weather saw no sight
 whale. Lat 35° 58'

Wednesday These 24 hours commenced with
Dec 7 strong breeze from the W. N. W.
 the 7 and fine weather ship under all
 sail by the wind all hands employed
 in Hoisting several fin backs in sight
 at 5 P.M. Juck in sail head to the
 South at 6 P.M. saw what board three
 boats carbide boat struck Cild and sunk
 Middle Part light breeze at 4 A.M.
 made sail head to the S.W. one ship in
 6.5.55 sight latter foggy Lat 35° 23' South.

Thursday These 24 hours commenced light breeze from
Dec 8 the westward ship under all sails by
 wind all hands employed on Hoisting
 6.5.47 at 9 A.M. finish Hoisting Middle Part
 light breeze at 4.30 made all sail and
 steered to the Southward at 6 A.M. began
 stowing down Latter Part light and from
 the North so ends these 24 hours Lat 35° 50'

Friday These 24 hours commenced with light
Dec 9 breeze from the Northward ship under all
 sail heading to the Southward all hands
 employed on stowing down at 6 P.M.
 finish stowing at 4 P.M. Juck in
 sail saw no whale this day Middle
 Part light breeze and fine weather at
 4 A.M. made all sail head to the
 Westward all hands employed on
 scraping down Latter Part stowing down
 so ends these 24 hours Lat 35° 53'

Saturday These 24 hours commenced with strong
Dec 10 breezes from the S.W. and fine weather
 ship under all sail all hands employed
 Longest Hoisting down at 4 P.M. Juck in the
 light sails Middle and Latter Part strong
 6.5.54 breeze and cloudy. Lat 35° 01'
