

Continued February 1837

Sunday These 24 hours began with fresh February winds from the ESE and cloudy weather. Ship under all sail by the 26 wind wack employed on ships duty. Ship head in North Middle Part. Sailed at 6 AM Capt. of W. B. & Co. St. Augustin bay let the main topgallant sail latter part strong breeze. So ended these 24 hours. Lat By obs 25.48

Monday These 24 hours commenced with brisk E. by S. gales from the ESE and cloudy weather. Ship under all sail. Sailed at 6 PM. Duble 48.44. The topsail Middle part. Sailed East weather such in the main sail. At 7 AM Stead W. & W. Latter part heavy gales and heavy seas this day.

Tuesday These 24 hours commenced with E. by S. gales from the Eastward and heavily attended with showers of rain. Sailed at 3 PM. Tuck in the fore topsail. Turned up the west boat and took in 4.5. 18. The bow boat Middle Part heavy gale East ship head NW. Latter part continued the same. Lat By obs 26.48

Wednesday These 24 hours commenced with E. by S. gales from the North and heavy sea on ship lying to under Longest Eldest Reef main topsail fore staysail and Mizzen at 4 PM. Mord 4.4.49. Let the fore sail Mizzen staysail let one reef out the main topsail at 12 Midnight wore ship to the North at 4 AM made all sail and Stead NW. Latter part fresh breeze. Lat By obs

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Thursday These 24 hours commenced with March with fresh breeze from the west 2 the and cloudy ship under all sail by the wind ship head NW. At 4 PM began sweating hole Middle Part light breezes and pleasant. 4.4.18 at 5 AM saw two ships one the ship and head of New Bedford at 10 AM Capt. Little went on board the ship. Latter part calm. Lat By obs 26.50

Friday These 24 hours commenced with light airs and calm ship under all sail by the wind crew employed on ships duty at 6 PM. Capt. Little 2.3.51 came on board Middle Part light breeze and pleasant at 9 AM made the land latter part fine breeze and pleasant. Lat By obs 27.29

Saturday These 24 hours commenced with fine March breeze from the Eastward and fair weather. Ship under all sail by the wind wack employed on ships duty. One sail in sight at 11 PM. Took aboard at 4.30 AM. Made all sail and stood in for the land at 10 AM. Mord came to anchor in 11 August ten fathoms with the starboard anchor in 18 fathoms of water with 50 fathoms of chain. So ended these 24 hours.

Sunday These 24 hours commenced with strong March wind from the SE. Ship lying in St. Augustin bay at 10 PM. The ship at anchor at 11 AM. Wagoner head of Rochester at 2 PM. Let the starboard wack go on shore at the Content. Wack so ended these days wack 18 hours.
