Saturday These 24 hours Commence with
May fish gales from the S.W. and S.W. and S.W.

May the 15 and squall attended with heavy squalls
Ship lying tow under Closest Reef main
topsail and fore and main staysail
Middle part heavy showers of rain at
7 am set the reef fore sail at 8 P.M.
made the island of St. Pauls Barriers
S.W. part 20 miles latter part 37.33
set the Closest Reef fore and main
topsails latter part 37.33

Tuesday These 24 hours Commence with heavy gale
May the 16 from the S.W. and squall ship under
Closest Reef topsails and main sail
S.E. part the land seen in sight to the
west at 10 P.M. were ship to the North
at 5 am were ship to the S.E. latter
part strong gale took in the main
topsail sail and double reef the topsail
the land 5 miles of

Wednesday These 24 hours Commence with
May Strong gale from the S.W. and squall
the 17 ship lying of aid on at Amsterdam
Island under Closest Reef fore and main
topsails at 3 P.M. spoke the ship heavy
of Edgar tower with the New Bl of oil
at 5 P.M. were ship to the North Middle
part strong gale at 8 am were ship
to the South at 11 am were ship to the
North so ended these 24 hours

Thursday These 24 hours Commence with strong
May the 18 gale from the S.W. and squall
weather with under double reef topsails
the island Baring W.S.W. Middle part strong
gale and cloudy weather at 8 am were
ship and stood in for the land at 4
am went in showers with three boats
saw no whale but opened fishery and
Mathews tow Boat and ship carried off
the London tow Boat so ended the 24 hours

Friday These 24 hours Commence with strong
May the 19 gale from the S.W. and cloudy ship
under Double Reef topsails lying of aid
on at Amsterdam Island Middle part
light breeze at 6 am went with three
boats saw two whale Bow Boat struck
and killed and hauled latter part

Saturday These 24 hours Commence with light breeze
May the 20 from the S.W. and fair weather ship
lying of aid on at Amsterdam Island
at 6 am sent in the boats but did not
any whale at 10 am came on board
and took up the boats latter part
Double Reef the topsails so ended
these 24 hours
