

Dartmouth 1837

Saturday These 24 hours began with
July light winds from the South &
the 1st Boat went shore the West
cutting in the whale middle
Part light winds and calm
latter Part the Boat in shore

Sunday These 24 hours began with light
July the 1st winds the boats in shore
struck a whale to the west Boat
and got her to the ship at half
Past 5 PM got her up and locked on
at 6 PM and half Past 9 got her
in middle Part calm latter Part
light winds and thick weather
Many by times at 4 AM 2 Boats in
shore commenced haying

Monday These 24 hours began with Mon.
July the 3rd at breezes from the N & E middle
Part much the same at 6 AM
2 Boats went in shore struck
a whale to the Carbond Boat got her
cut off towing down oil aft latter
strong breeze Harbours

Tuesday These 24 hours began with light
July the 4th winds got the Steamer Boat at
the ship at 4 PM middle Part
fish froze finished haying at
3 AM at 6 PM 3 Boats went in
shore and came up at 10 strong
gale about kept the Topsail
to Enrich these 24 hours

of Amherst Island Island

Wednesday These 24 hours commenced with
July strong gale from the East all hands
5th Employed towing down oil aft - Rock
in fore and Mizzen Topsail moved
Part thick at 6 AM let the Topsail
at 6 AM 3 Boats went in shore
came off at 10 AM strong breeze

Thursday These 24 hours began with
July the 6th strong winds from the N & E
at 4 PM took in fore and Mizzen
Topsail at 5 let Topsails close
kept middle Part strong winds
latter Part moderate 3 Boats in
shore

Friday These 24 hours began with
July light winds from the N & E 3 Boats
7th in shore saw several whale
middle Part strong breeze from the
N & E latter Part strong gale took in
fore and Mizzen Topsails close kept
the main Topsail at 10 kept the
fore sail heaving to the N & E

Saturday These 24 hours began with strong
July the 8th gale from the N & E and heavy
at 3 PM hauled the key out of the
fore sail heaving N & E at 10 PM
the wind shifted to the N & E
took in the fore sail middle
Part heavy gale stove the Starboard
Boat all the crew were ship
to the N & E at 4 AM the land
Bore East latter Part heavy
gale with squalls of rain
and sail in light
