July strong breeze from the front the

July These 24 hours began with
27 the strong winds from S.W. 3/4 S. heading
west 3/4 S.W. under about 1/2 topsails
and main sail at 2 P.M. saw
the land Amsterdam bearing by
compass west middle Part light
winds and squally heading S.W. 3/4 W.
at 4 P.M. noon ship to S.W. 3/4 W.
latter Part light winds

Friday These 24 hours began with light
July breeze from the S.W. 3/4 W. steering
28 the wind S.W. 3/4 W. middle Part
fish breeze at 7 A.M. about 11
the topsails at 8 A.M. 3 boats went
in shore struck anchor to the Bow
boat and broad

Saturday
July These 24 hours began with moderate
29 the breeze from the South 3/4 West
in shore struck anchor to the Bow
boat and cut struck one to the
harbord boat and broad boards
Part light winds at 6 A.M. 3 boats
went in shore struck anchor to the
harbord boat and took her to the ship
at 10 A.M.

Sunday
July These 24 hours began with
30 the moderate breeze hooked on the anchor
and commenced cutting at 2 P.M. 3 boats
went in shore struck anchor to the
harbord boat 3 boats got store
get the whole long side at 8 P.M.
hooked on at 9 strong winds from
S.W. 3/4 S. got her cut in at half past
one noon latter Part strong winds from
the north heading to the S.W. 3/4 W.
under about 1/2 main topsails
the work employed at cleaning up
the deck

Monday
July These 24 hours began with strong
31 the wind from the S.W. 3/4 S. heading west
at 1 P.M. commenced heaving at 5
A.M. hook the topsails middle
Part hook in the fore sail and was
ship to the S.W. 3/4 S. latter Part strong
wind and some rain
