and squally at 7 A.M. more ship to
the South all hands employed
at braching out the fore headway

Wednesday
August These 24 hours began with
S. the strong wind from the W.S.W. head
ing South under closest Mast main
topsails all hands employed at
stowing down oil in the fore hatch
middle Part fresh breeze at 6 A.M.
thick weather at 8 the Boat went
in there struck a whale to the west
Boat and turned her up

Saturday These 24 hours began with strong
August from the W.S.W. got the whale
S. the along side at 2 P.M. hooked on at 3
got the throat and lips in piece Row out
whale hulk Parted the chain and
lost her main sail middle Part
light winds. Latter Part much
the same 3 Boats in there struck
a whale to the east Boat and head

Sunday
August These 24 hours began with moderate
S. the breeze from the W.S.W. 3 Boats in
there struck a whale to the east Boat
but the line with the Spad struck
one to the harbor Boat the line parted
one to the west Boat and cut middle
Part fresh breeze from the N.W.
Latter Part 3 Boats in there struck
a whale to the harbor Boat and drove
west Boat faster and drove in the surf
Latter Part thick squally and Hany
Came on Board Closest Mast the topsails

Monday
August These 24 hours began with a light breeze from
S. the the S.W. under closest Mast topsails
at 1 P.M. squared the yards and headed
the Boat to the side of Furnace
at 2 P.M. Amsterdam Boat S.W. hit 6
miles at 3 P.M. Hook in the west
Boat and turned up the harbor Boat
middle Part more moderate latter
Part steady S.W. under all sails
wind at west the work employed
in hoisting and minding the
main topsails sail
